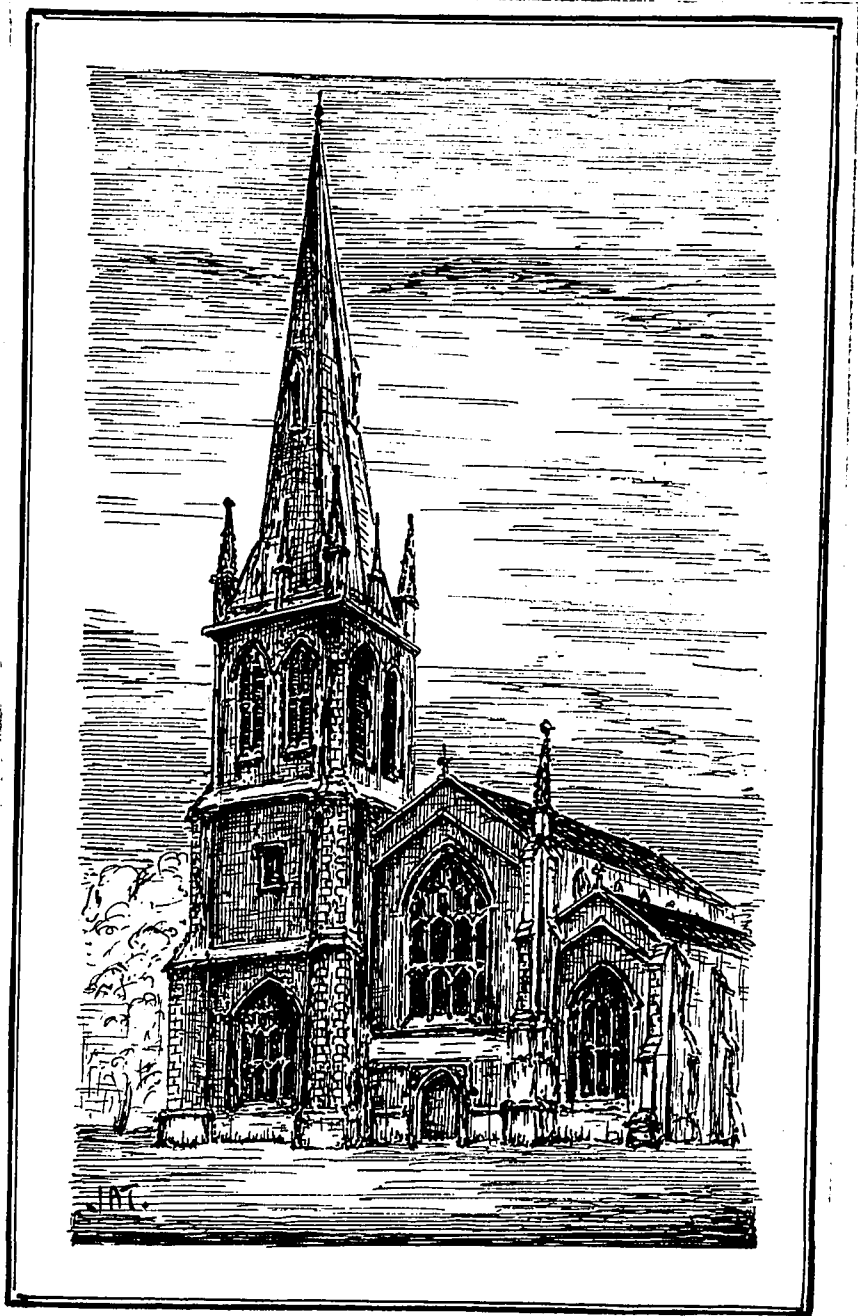

The Peal Books,  
& Records of the London Ringing  
Societies in the Eighteenth Century.

The following are transcripts of the entries in all the extant peal books relating to the eighteenth century. Of them the following are copied from the original manuscripts now in the British Museum Library - the Union Scholars, the Eastern Scholars, the two societies of London Youths, the Junior Cumberlands, and the College Youths between the years 1726 and 1745. The records of the Cumberland Youths, the Junior Society of College Youths, and the College Youths not included in the original and incomplete manuscript are from Osborn's copies.

With the exception of the Junior Cumberlands' records, the whole are from Osborn's Collection,

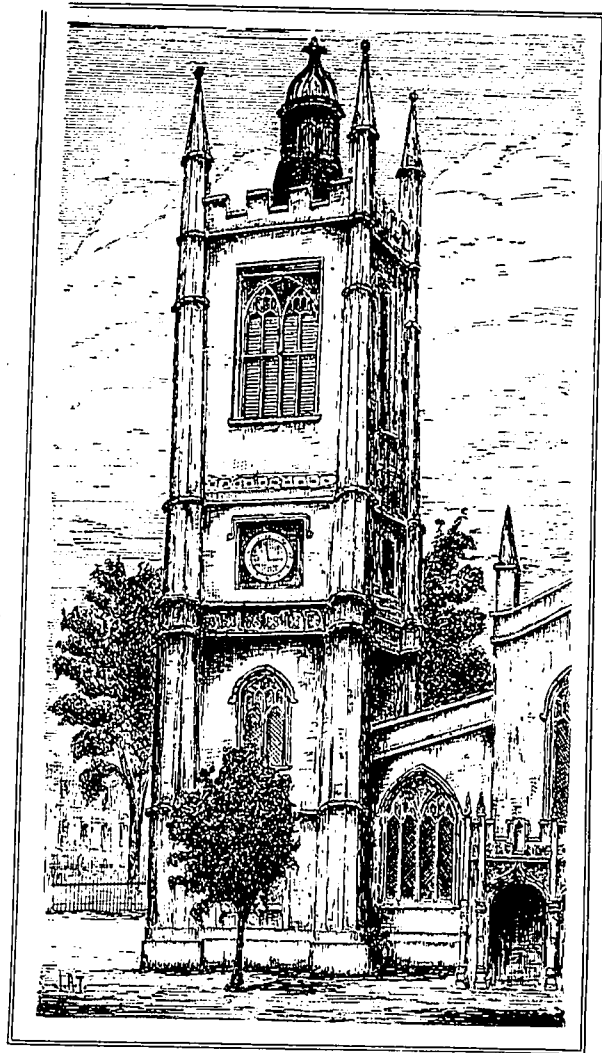
which shows how greatly the historian is indebted to him for his painstaking efforts in collecting material which otherwise would have been irretrievably lost.

In addition there are copies of the rules of the Union Scholars, the ancient Society of College Youths, the Cumberland Youths, and the St. Stephen's Society of Bristol, as well as transcripts of peal boards, some of which are no longer extant, and a chronological table of the peals known to have been rung during the century.

Roughly speaking we have here all the information we possess of peal ringing throughout the country before the year 1800.

It was my intention to make a copy of the records up to about the year 1830 and so cover the period dealt with in my History of London ringing, but, owing to the outbreak of war, the manuscript department of the

British Museum has been closed,  
and the hope of completing the series must  
be left to happier times. It was fortunate  
that I had been able to make a transcript  
of everything up to the end of the eighteenth  
century.



## The Union Scholars Records.

The Records belonging to the Society of Union Scholars are now in the manuscript department of the library at the British Museum. They consist of a set of Rules, a list of names "Commencing from the first of May in the year one Thousand seven hundred and thirteen", and an account of peals rung between 1718 and 1757. The writing throughout is the work of one man James Albion and was done during the years 1747 to 1757. It varies a good deal in character some of it being a very neat and clear script and some a very ornate Gothic with florid decoration. The first peal recorded is the 5040 Hick Trebles rung in 1718. This is in the same writing as the others although the style and that of the first peals is different from the later ones. Albion evidently copied an earlier record and copied it verbatim. The first records of all the societies seem to have been in ordinary script We ~~do~~ still have examples in the M.S.S of the Scholars of Clepside, the

The M.S.S of the Esquire Youths and the fragment<sup>7</sup>  
of belonging to the College Youths.

As the record of the 1718 peal is not  
strictly contemporary, Osborn and Jasper  
Snowdon are mistaken in thinking it  
to be the oldest record of a peal in  
writing. That distinction belongs to  
the first entry in the Eastern Scholars'  
peal book.

James Albion may be said to have  
been the originator of the decorative style  
of recording peals although some  
attempt in that direction was made  
by the writers of the early entries in  
the Eastern Scholars' book. He worked  
for most of the London societies of his  
time. The name and peal book  
now belonging to the College Youths is  
his work, and so too are the later  
entries of the Eastern Scholars peal book  
much if not all their name book and  
the early part of the Cumberlands'  
name book.

He was elected a member of the  
Society of Union Scholars in and  
rang in many of their peals. In 1754



he was appointed head master of a large school in Bath and left London. Three or four years later when the society lapsed the book was sent to him unless he already had it to write up. When he died in 1805 it was handed to one John Rush to give to the Bath Abbey Society instead of which he kept it in his own possession till his death. It was afterwards in the hands of several people until 1846 when Osborn visited Bath searching for information about ringing. He was shown it, and to his astonishment asked the meaning of such a Book. He bought it for ten shillings. It was probably in a very dilapidated condition. On his return to London he took it to pieces cleaned the leaves, mounted them on new paper, and had it bound up with the Eastern Scholars book and a number of engravings of churches famous in ringing history. Gannell's account is rather different

In his MSS he says that Albion "left the 9  
Union Scholars Manuscript Book to Mr.  
William Fry, by trade a plumber and  
glazier also a Bath Abbey Change Ringer  
to preserve and hand down to posterity"

Garnell, who made this entry on Aug 27<sup>th</sup>  
1817, says he had rung with Albion at  
Bath in the year 1791 and that "he died  
a very old man in Bath City and was  
buried in the same place with ringing  
honours and with the bells muffled  
and a short peal performed on them  
about ~~the~~ the year I think 1797 or  
1800

This Mr James Albion was  
a small boned little man not quite  
so tall as Mr William Booth a  
table knife cutter Bailey Lane, town  
of Sheffield Yorkshire."

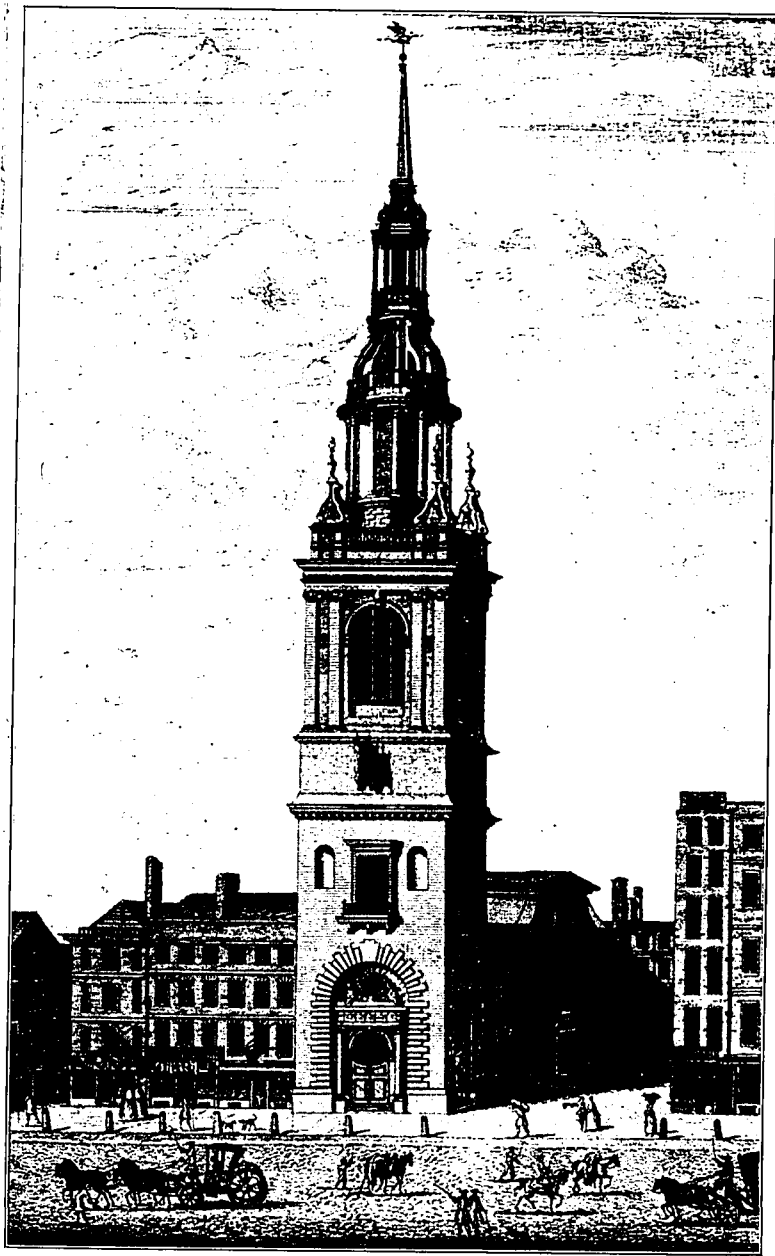

## The Records of the Society of College Youths

---

Of the following accounts of peals rung by the College Youths from 1724 to the time of the death of Benjamin Arnable Nos. 9 to 57 are copied from the original M.S. in the British Museum. The peculiarities of spelling and phrasing are as far as possible reproduced. The entries are in ordinary script, the time taken to ring the peals is seldom given, there are no figures to show which bell each man rang, but presumably the order in which they are written is the order in which they stood. The Conductor is indicated by a cross. This M.S. is obviously the original from which James Albion copied the peal book now in the Society's possession.

The accounts of the other peals are copied from Osborn's transcript of Albion's book.

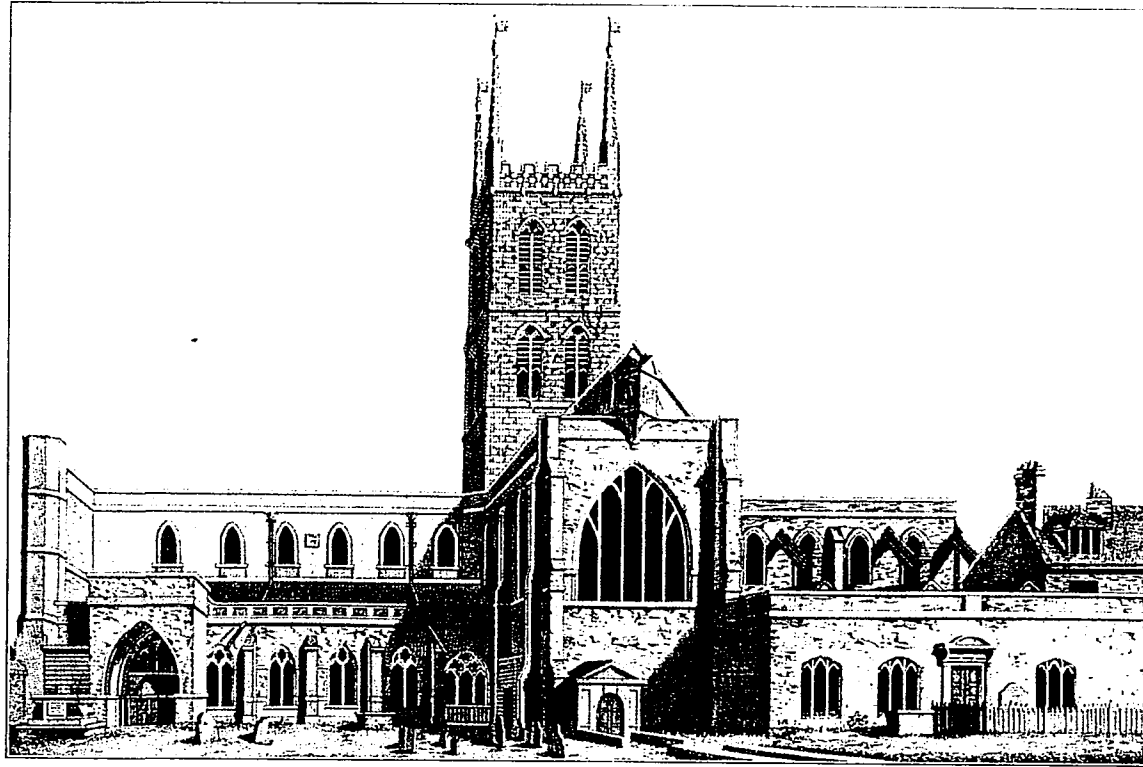

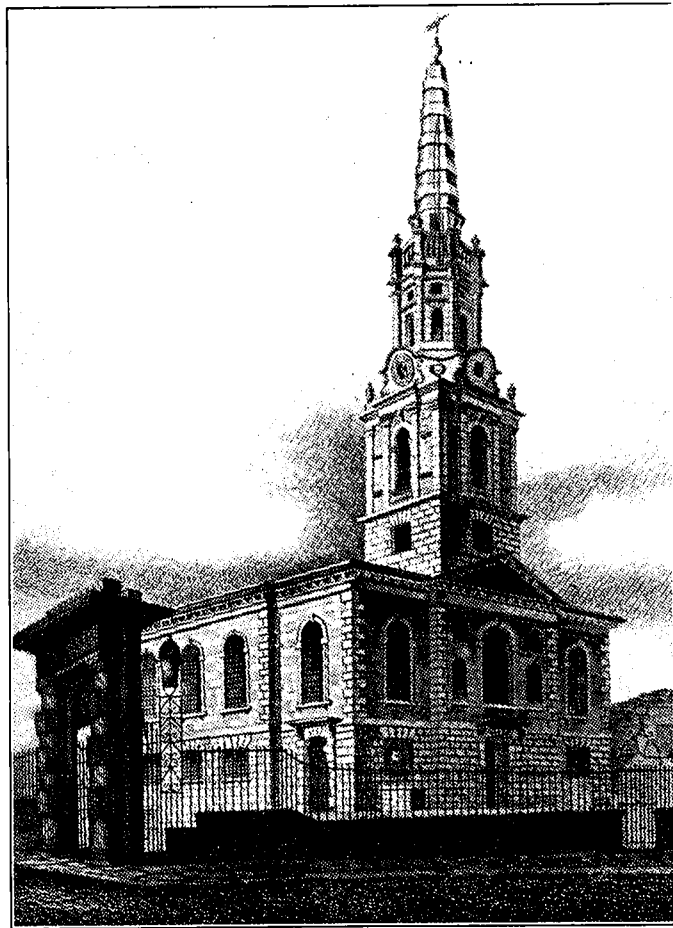

Rules of the ancient  
Society of College Youths.

The following is copied from a printed sheet in the British Museum. The rules were obviously drawn up as part of a scheme (by William Jones) to revive the fortunes of the society which had afterwards a short period of prosperity and finally lapsed in the year 1788.

Rules and Orders To be observed by the Ancient and Respectable Society of Colledge Youth.

I  
Imprimis

That this Society meet at the House of Mr Hill, the Pawn, in Saint Martins Lane every Thursday Evening, between the Hours of Seven and Eight o'Clock.

II

That the Company do not make it later than Nine o'Clock before they go up to ring.

III

That the Warner of this Society take care to see the Steeple kept clean, the Ropes in good Order and a proper Number of Candles for the Company to ring by.

IV

That no Landlord at any House where the Company or Society shall think proper to meet be admitted a Member

V

That on the admission of a new Member such Member to pay to the Warner or Beadle of the Society One Shilling as a Customary Fee.

VI

That no Stranger be admitted into this Society without Leave first obtained from either Master or Stewards, and in case the Master or Stewards

are not present, then a Majority of Voices from the sitting Members must be had before the admission of any such Stranger.

VII

That if any Member ~~shall~~ of this Society shall meet any other Society with ~~the~~ an Intention of becoming a Member thereof, and should be rejected, such Member shall be excluded this Society, unless upon his due Submission, and acknowledging his Fault, the Society in this Case may think proper to ballot whether he shall continue in this Society a Member as before.

VIII

That if any Member of this Society shall revolt, and set his Name down in any other Society, whereby he becomes a Member, and in Process of Time shall have an Inclination to come back again, such Member shall have no Admission before balloted for by the Society, and on his having a Majority to become a Member thereof, such Member shall pay double

Fees to the Peacemaker or Warner of the Society

IX

That every Member on ringing his first Peal to pay to the Warner or Peacemaker of the Society one Shilling each, for the Benefit of the said Warner.

X

That if any Member attempts to pick any Quarrel in the Club Room, whereby the Peace of the Society is destroyed, the offending Member shall be fined five-pence, and on his refractory Behaviour in this Point, such Member shall be obliged to quit the Club Room for that Night only.

XI

That on any Meeting Night, the Society shall think fit proper to make an Appointment to ring a Peal at any Place, in Town or Country, it is desired that no Member will promise to go before he has considered whether he can make good his Promise; a Disappointment of this Nature being of the greatest Consequence. And if any Member violate this Rule, unless he can prove that he was indisposed, he must

submit to be fined One Shilling to be spent, it is expected that this Rule be paid due Attention to, as no Method of Expulsion can be made Use of for this Offence.

XII

That a general Meeting of this Society be held at least Five Weeks before the Feast, to take into Consideration and examine the Abilities of the Master and Stewards, whether they be able and willing to bear the Expence attending such Feast; and on the Failure of any One or more of the Stewards to provide accordingly, and so judiciously conduct matters that no Debt may be contracted to fall on the Society.

XIII

That the Master and Stewards cause Tickets to be printed and directed to the several Members to be delivered by the Warner of this Society, and that all Members contribute One Shilling each for the Benefit of the said Warner: such Collection to be made immediately after

Dinner on the Feast Day according to annual Custom.

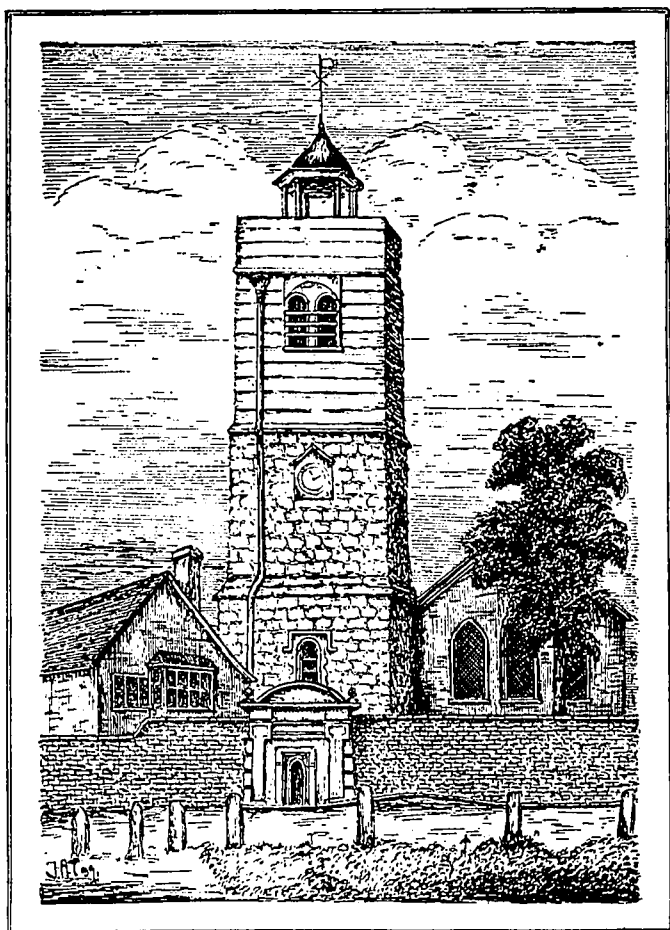

That if any Member or Members of this  
Society shall not be at the place appointed

o'clock. he or they shall forfeit 2<sup>d</sup>, if he  
or they come not at all four pence

That if any Member or Members of this  
Society shall not be at the place appointed  
for the quarterly seal precisely at 3 o'clock  
he or they shall forfeit 3<sup>d</sup>. if he or they

Come not at all suspense

That the Master or Treasurer or any other member in their absence that know best shall set every Man to his Bell & he or they that shall refuse to ring that Bell, he or they are set to then he or they shall forfeit 4<sup>d</sup>.

That if any member of this Society shall ring with any other Society upon the weeks months or quarterly peals that the said Society of Cumberland Youths do ring on or any other peal appointed by the Master or Company and neglect meeting his own Society he shall forfeit 7<sup>d</sup>.

That if any Member of this Society shall give his Bell out of his hand to any Ringer of another Society without he ask leave of the Master or by the consent of the Company then ringing he shall forfeit 6<sup>d</sup>.

That if any Member of this Society shall swear, curse, abuse, or challenge any of his Brothers to ring in the Society or shall be disguised by liquor he shall forfeit 1<sup>d</sup>.

That if any person shall go away at any weeks months or quarterly peals without paying his club or speaking to any member to pay for him he shall forfeit 1<sup>d</sup>.

That if any member shall presume to smoke tobaces in the Steeple when the Society is ringing or going to ring he shall forfeit three pence.

That if any member shall go out of the Steeple to drink before the Society hath done ringing without it be with a friend he shall forfeit 2<sup>d</sup>.

That if any member shall go to the House to drink whilst the rest of the Society are ringing whatsoever he calls for music pay it himself, if he charge it to the Society for every five pence he shall pay sixpence.

That the Master once a year shall have power to command the Society ten Miles out of London and he shall refuse to go shall pay 2/6.

That if the Treasurer shall neglect bringing the Book of forfeits or the Book, on any months or quarters feal he shall forfeit his pence.

That if any Member shall refuse to pay his forfeits at the months feal he shall pay 2<sup>d</sup> if not pay'd at the quarters feal he shall pay sixpence.

That the Master, Treasurer, or Stewards that shall be absent or late at either weeks months or quarters feals he or they shall pay or forfeit as much more as any other Member.

That the Master Treasurer or Stewards shall have the ordering of all the months feals, the Master first the Treasurer next and then the Stewards every one in order and all the quarters feals are at the Master's disposal.

And lastly 'tis ordered if any Member of this Society shall be sick or in the Country provided he be 10 miles out of Town he shall be excused

Saturday <sup>4<sup>th</sup></sup> July 1810

Resolved that at the meeting of this evening that no person whatsoever shall be admitted in Town or Country excepting at the Club House of this Society on meeting nights unless the Master and Stewards or any or either of them for the time being or any two Town Members or one Town Member and the Beadle are present and the Master Stewards Members or Beadle so taken the name of the person or persons as aforesaid shall on the next Club night after the person or persons shall be so made a Member or Members at such private meeting be mentioned and approved of before such person or persons names shall be subscribed in the Club Book and until such name or names are inserted shall not be deemed as legal Members of this Society.

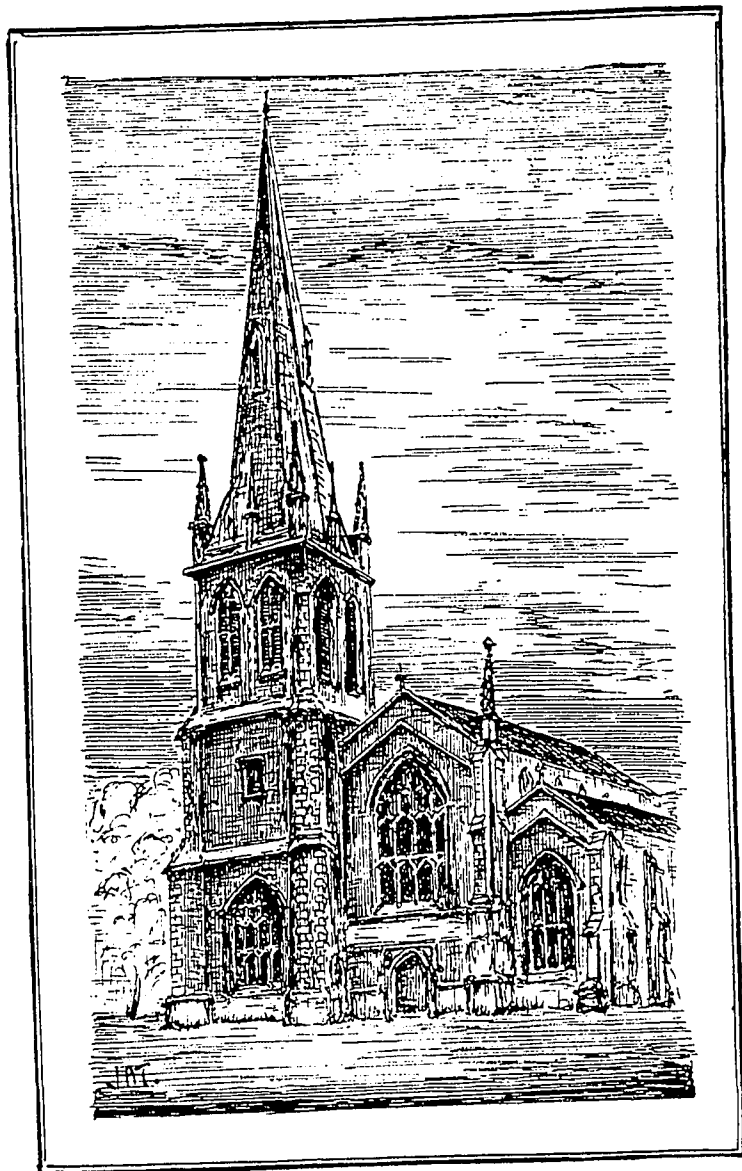

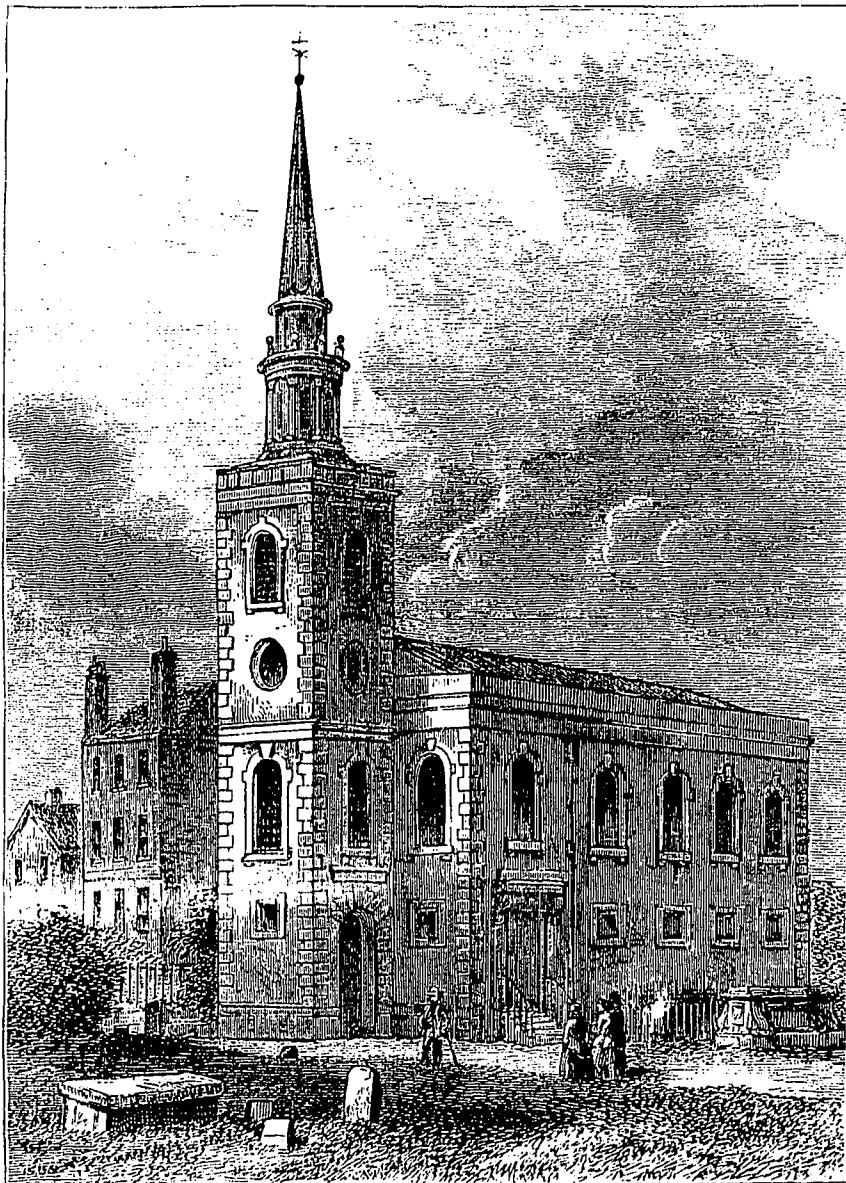

ROTHERHITHE, or, as it is occasionally called, "Redriff," is worthy of note as the first place where docks were constructed for the convenience of London. The parish adjoins Bermondsey on the east, and extends along the southern shore of the Thames as far as Deptford. The compiler of the "New View of London," published in 1708, considers Rotherhithe as "equivalent to 'Red Rose Haven,' probably from some such sign being there, as 'Rother' Lane (now called Pudding Lane) had that name from the sign of a red rose there." Northouck, too, supports this view, telling us that the name of the place was formerly Red Rose Hithe, "from the sign of the Red Rose." Maitland, however, with greater reason, supposes the name to be of Saxon origin, and that it was derived from the two words, *redhra*, a mariner, and *lyth*, a haven. *Hithe*, or *lythe*, as is well known, is a common name for the lower port or haven of maritime towns, such as Colchester, Southampton, &c. Rotherhithe, we may remark, was chiefly inhabited a hundred years ago, as now, by seafaring persons and tradesmen whose business depended on seamen and shipping. The place is summarily dispatched in the "Ambulator" for 1774, in the following terms:—"Rotherhith (*sic*), vulgarly called Rederiff, was anciently a village on the south-east of London, though it is now joined on to Southwark, and as it is situated along the south bank of the Thames, is chiefly inhabited by masters of ships and other seafaring people." It will be remembered that Gay, in the *Beggar's Opera*,

to have begun his famous trench to Vauxhall, for the purpose of laying siege to London, as stated in a previous chapter.\* The channel through which the tide of the Thames was turned in the year when London Bridge was first built of stone, is supposed by Stow and by several antiquaries to have followed the same course, though many writers have dissented from this view.

In a grant of the time of Edward III., by which Constance, then Prior of Bermondsey, assigned certain messuages to the king, the name is spelt "Rethereth." At the time of the Domesday survey the place was included in the royal manor of Bermondsey; but Henry I. granted part of it to his natural son Robert, Earl of Gloucester. In the reign of Edward III. one of the two manors into which Rotherhithe was divided belonged to the Abbey of St. Mary of Grace, on Tower Hill; but in the following year it was devised to the convent of St. Mary Magdalen, at Bermondsey, whose sisterhood already possessed that portion of the other manor which had not been given to the Earl of Gloucester. About the middle of the fifteenth century the manor appears to have come into possession of the Lovel family. It was at this time a place of some note. In the reign of Edward III. a fleet had been fitted out there by order of the Black Prince and John of Gaunt. Afterwards Henry IV. resided there in an old stone house, when afflicted with leprosy; he is said to have dated two charters thence. The Lovel family, highly distinguished themselves during the wars of

HISTORICAL ACCOUNT.

1. The most authentic records extant prove that the College Youths are the oldest Society of Ringers in existence, they began to be a Company Nov. 5 1637 (in the Reign of Charles the 1st.) and met to ring on a peal of six bells at St. Martin's Vintry on College Hill, London, and so took the name of College Youths.
8. For some time they rang nothing but rounds and set changes but at length attained to ring a plain six score on five bells; and it is thought to be about 96 years ago since changes were first attempted to be rung, which was in 1642 — About 1667 they began to practise Double Changes on five, and six bells,
16. for in that year there was published a book ~~by~~ <sup>by</sup> Fabian Steadman<sup>2</sup>, which contained many five bell peals and Grandsire bob or Six — which we call Plain Bob — In 1671, that book was again reprinted by Steadman, with many more peals added, and we have an account that Steadman's principle was

- first rung at St. Bennetts in Cambridge by  
 24. the College Youths March 30th. 1671.  
 Thus they went on for many years practising  
 on five, and six, bells, and the first great  
 performance we have any account of was at

## The Chronology of the Eighteenth Century

---

The chronology of the early eighteenth century is somewhat complicated by the difference between the old style and the new style. Before 1750 the unreformed Julian calendar was in use and the year began on March 25<sup>th</sup>. In that year an Act of Parliament was passed which introduced the Gregorian or reformed calendar, dropped eleven days, and fixed the beginning of the legal year on January 1<sup>st</sup>.

For a long time before that many people had already been using the new style (which was customary on the Continent) and therefore some care is necessary to see which has been used.

In some cases both are given; in some we can tell from the context; but in

many there is a doubt

The early entries in the College Youths' psal book are quite definitely in old style but we cannot be sure whether the Reverse Bob Major at Westminster was rung in 1751 or 1752 and I have elsewhere called attention to the two psals of Treble Bob rung by the Eastern Scholars and the College Youths at Spitalfields

The use of the old style did not at once cease with the passing of the Act of Parliament. In some parts of the Country it lasted until the latter part of the nineteenth century, and I was myself acquainted with people in the villages of Norfolk who paid their rents on "old" quarter days i. e. eleven days later than the legal ones.

In the following tables the dates are corrected to new style so far as the year

is concerned. Thus, for instance,  
the feal of Grandsire Cinques which (following  
the feal board and feal book) is usually  
said to have been rung in 1724, is given as  
1725; and we can now see that as soon as  
Benjamin Annable had got his feal-  
ringing band together, he went straight  
forward: there was not, as might appear  
from the feal book, a gap of fourteen months  
between his second and third feals.

The difference in styles will also account  
for the statement in the Clavis that Annable  
"died in the latter part of the year 1755". The  
actual date was February 1<sup>st</sup> 1756 (N.S.).

I have made no attempt to correct the  
day of the month or to allow for the  
dropped eleven days, but it may be  
pointed out that if a band wanted to  
observe with meticulous accuracy the  
bicentenary of, say, the first feal of

Double P. N. Maximus, they should do so on the 4<sup>th</sup> of April, 1940 and not on the 24<sup>th</sup> of March.

The following tables give every peal which is at present known to have been rung in London or by London ringers up to the end of the eighteenth century, and the majority of those known to have been rung in the provinces. But it is quite certain that there were many other performances the records of which are now lost.

## ST. STEPHEN'S GUILD.

## ANCIENT RULES FOR THE ORDERING OF RINGERS.

In an article in these columns a fortnight ago we briefly outlined the history of the Antient Guild of St. Stephen's Ringers, an old Bristol Society which, while it is not now connected with ringing, had its origin in the ringers of that church more than three hundred years ago. To-day the Guild devotes its energies largely to raising funds for the preservation and restoration of the church.

There has recently been published on behalf of the Antient Society a handsome volume. The author is Mr. H. E. Boslyn, a member of the Guild, who has compiled an exhaustive history of the Guild, so far as it can be traced, based mainly on the minute books which, with one exception, are intact from 1682. An interesting history of the church is also given, as well as a description of the handsome tower.

The church was founded between 1247 and 1291, and was attached to Glastonbury Abbey, this connection lasting until the dissolution of the monasteries, when the patronage passed to the Crown, in whom it is still vested. The church was rebuilt about 1470, the tower being erected at the sole cost of Master John Shipward, who also gave the great east window. Shipward was one of the most important citizens of Bristol of his day. He was a wealthy merchant, and was the second of his family to fill the highest office in the city. His father was Mayor in 1444 and 1453, and he himself served as Mayor in 1463 and again in 1469. He also represented Bristol in Parliament in 1460.

He left directions for a most elaborate funeral, as was the custom of rich men in those days, and also for the observance of the anniversary of his death. He charged his property with the maintenance of two chaplains for twenty-five years, and after that one chaplain in perpetuity to celebrate daily at the high altar of St. Stephen's for the good of his soul and the souls of his parents. A solemn requiem mass was to be celebrated every year on August 3rd, in connection with which there were a number of bequests, including twentypence for tolling the bells.

In the records of the Antient Guild, however, probably the most interesting portion to ringers is 'The Ordinances,' sometimes known as the 'charter.' These ordinances have been transcribed at various dates, but they are directly traceable to 1620, and it is supposed that even those of this date were a transcription of an even earlier copy. The ordinances, which are read every year, as a part of the ritual observed at the annual banquet, begin with the following preamble:—

'It is agreed and determined that everyone that is or shall be of the Company or Society of St. Stephen's Ringers, shall keep all Articles and Decrees that are or shall be specified in this Ordinary concerning the good government and Peaceable Society of the said Company, and that none shall be of the said Society but those that shall be of Honest, Peaceable and Good Conversation, and such that shall be at all time and times ready to defend whatsoever shall be alleged against the said Company as well in regard to any Challenge as of any other Wrong or Injury that shall be offered and done by anyone of what estate or Condition soever he be, so that we may not only stop the mouths of those that would or shall exasperate themselves against us. But also gain credit and Reputation by our Musical Exercise that others of our rich neighbours hearing these loud Cymbals with their ears may by the Sweet Harmony thereof be enlarged in their hearts to pull one string to make it more sweet and for these and other causes We have procured this Ordinary and do confine ourselves to these Articles following.'

Then follow the twenty-six Articles as under:—

1.—Item. For the choosing of every Master you shall put three honest men into the Election, and he that hath most voices to pass on his side shall be Master of the Company of Ringers for the year ensuing.

2.—Item. For the choosing of Wardens you shall put four honest men into the Election, and those two of the four that have most voices shall be Wardens of the said Company for the year ensuing.

3.—Item. You shall have four Quarter days every year (that is to say), the first, St. Stephen the Martyr; the second, the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary; the third, St. John the Baptist; and the fourth, St. Michael the Archangel.

4.—Item. Upon everyone of the said Quarter Days everyone that is a Freeman of the said Company shall pay to the Master for the time being for his quarterage one penny, and if he doth or shall deny or neglect to pay the same he shall pay for such his offence threepence, one penny thereof to the Sexton and the other two pence to the Company.

5.—Item. Every Master for the time being shall settle up his account on the seventeenth day of November all Quarteridges and fines as he shall receive in his year, and if he shall deny or neglect he shall pay for his offence the sum of twenty shillings to the Company of his own proper money.

6.—Item. Every Master shall be chosen on Michaelmas Day between five and eight of the clock in the morning. If the Master shall neglect to send the Wardens to warn the Company so that by that means the day be deferred, he shall pay for his offence the sum of six shillings to the Company.

7.—Item. There shall be none made free of the said Company unless he give the Company a Breakfast or pay the sum of three shillings and fourpence in money.

8.—Item. If the Master for the time being shall send to the Wardens to warn the Company, and if they neglect the same shall pay for their offence fourpence apiece, one penny thereof to the Sexton and the other threepence to the Company.

9.—Item. If the Master for the time being shall neglect or forget to warn the Company once within every fourteen days for to ring a Bissit sett peale he shall pay for his offence one shilling to be divided amongst the Company.

10.—Item. If the Master for the time being shall send to the Sexton concerning a peale that shall be rung either at night or in the morning or at any other time that the Master shall please to ring, if he shall deny or neglect to come at the every hour that the Master doth appoint him he shall pay for his offence twopence to be divided among the Company.

11.—Item. Everyone that is made free of the said Company shall pay to the Sexton fourpence for his fee.

12.—Item. If anyone of the said Company after the time that he shall come into the Church to ring shall curse or swear or make any noise or disturbance either in scoffing or unseemly jesting that the party so offending shall pay for his offence threepence to be divided as aforesaid.

13.—Item. If any of the said Company after the time that he shall come into the Church to ring shall be so saucy as to take a rope to ring before the Master for the time being and the eldest of the said Company who have been Masters shall be settled where they please to ring, the party so offending shall pay for such his offence twopence, one penny thereof to the Sexton and the other penny to the Company.

14.—Item. If any of the said Company shall miss to strike his bell at the second sway in the rising of a peale he shall for his offence pay one penny to the Company.

15.—Item. If any of the said Company shall speak or make any manner of noise when the Bells do ring so that the ringers or any of them by that means may make a fault, the party so offending shall pay for his offence threepence, to be divided among the Company.

16.—Item. If any of the said Company shall take a rope out of a fellow's hand when the bells do ring well and do make a fault to fly off or come too near, he shall pay for his offence one penny to the Company.

17.—Item. If any of the said Company do or shall after they have come together quarrell or misuse any of the said Company before they do depart, the party so offending shall pay for the offence sixpence to the use of the said Company.

18.—Item. It is agreed that everyone that shall be chosen Master of the said Company shall spend of his own proper money the sum of two shillings towards a breakfast, and the rest of the Company to pay the rest of the reckoning.

19.—Item. It is agreed that the persons who shall be chosen Wardens shall give unto the Master for the time being a pint of Wine apiece.

20.—Item. If any of the said Company shall be chosen Master and he shall refuse the same contrary to our Ordinary, he shall pay unto the Company three shillings and fourpence.

21.—Item. If any one of the said Company shall be chosen a Warden and shall refuse the same, he shall pay unto the said Company one shilling and sixpence.

22.—Item. If any of the said Company shall be so rude as to run into the Belfrey before he do kneel down and pray as every Christian ought to do, he shall pay for the first offence sixpence and for the second he shall be cast out of the Company.

23.—Item. If any one of the said Company shall deny to pay any fine or fines that shall be imposed on him by the Master and shall perempterly stand and contend in the same, he shall for his offence pay the sum of two shillings or else to be utterly excluded for ever without Bail or Mainprize.

24.—Item. It is agreed that yearly there shall be a peale rung upon the eighth day of October in remembrance of Mr. William Eytton deceased, who gave a legacy of Four Pounds unto the said Company, and if any shall refuse to assist to ring the same peal warning being given by the Master, he shall pay fourpence, and if the Master and Wardens for the time being shall fail to give warning they shall for their neglect pay one shilling apiece to the said company (who deceased in the year 1656).

Items 25 and 26, couched in the same terms, relate to the knells of George Witherly and William Nicholls.

To the Rate-payers of

My Lords Ladies and Gentlemen,

The office of Steeple-keeper of St. Martin's Church having become vacant through the death of Mr. Palmer the late Steeple-keeper the following observations are respectfully submitted to your serious consideration, previous to the choice of a person to fill that office; The importance of the trust committed to the Steeple-keeper in respect to the very considerable value of the Bells as a property is a circumstance too generally overlooked in the appointment of a person to that situation. The injury to which such property is liable - in some cases irreparable - and the consequent expense and disappointment occasioned to the parish through incapacity or neglect ought certainly to preclude the election



of any person who has not acquired a  
competent knowledge and ability for  
the care and management of the bells.  
And further though of less importance  
the gratification of the Parishioners in  
general in having their Bells properly  
rung on rejoicing days and other  
public occasions is not altogether  
unworthy of notice; for it is well  
known that at several respectable  
Parishes in the Metropolis whose Churches  
contain Bells very improper persons have  
been and now are in appointment; the  
consequence is their want of skill and  
ability in the art of ringing are utterly  
incapable of managing such a concern  
in which case the Bells are rendered  
distressing to the ringers, the parish  
frequently incurs a heavy expense, and  
a general dissatisfaction is the unavoidable  
result. The approaching appointment

Therefore affords an opportunity of completely obviating the inconveniences before mentioned

We the Society of College Youths who have had the ringing of your Bells on all public and rejoicing days for nearly half a Century, beg leave earnestly and respectfully to recommend to your notice Mr Charles Clay No 1 Pipemakers Alley Redfordbury as an ingenious desiccious person fully competent to all the duties of that important trust.

And we are further warranted in this opinion from his well-known conduct in the discharge of those duties as having been the principal acting person for the late Steeple-keeper, and now has charge of the Steeple, by order of the Churchwardens full the appointment takes place. In conclusion we beg to say that we feel satisfied

that if the situation should be fortunately  
conferred on him, the duties will be  
punctually fulfilled and the Bells  
on rejoicing days and other public  
occasions be rung to the entire  
satisfaction of the parishioners by  
respectable members of the Society of  
College Youths

## Hudsons' "New Light"

March 26. 1843 On Tuesday the  
Sheffield St Peter's Company of Change Ringers  
ascended the steeple and rang 5600 of  
Hudsons New Light on Treble Bob Major  
in the time of 3 hours and 46 minutes  
being the first in that method ever rung  
by any company of Campanologists. The  
band was stationed as follows Wm Hudson  
s: 1. Thomas Whaley 2. Isaac Lomas 3  
Geo. Hudson 4. John Lomas J: 5. Thomas  
Crossland 6. James Firth 7. Wm Hudson J  
Tenor. In the above method of ringing  
Treble Bob the plain course contains 800  
changes and the peal was rung with  
only nine bobs. Composed & Conducted  
by Mr William Hudson sen: who has  
received great praise for the work.

April 23. 1843 Monday Eve: the  
Junior Company of Change Ringers belonging  
to Wakefield old parish church ascended  
the steeple of Liversedge church and  
there rang a fine peal of treble bob

majors consisting of 8000 Changes  
which they completed in the short  
space of four hours and a half. The  
peal was composed in two parts with  
25 Courses in each part and the  
tenors at home every Course end without  
going into the slow hunt. Each part  
contained 7 Cobs, 14 Cobs Completing.

The peal This new mode of Composing  
was found out by Mr. William Hudson  
of Sheffield who composed the  
above peal and kindly presented it  
to the above named society. The

following are the names of the band  
as stationed W. Hulnes 1. Stephen Treastley,  
Joseph Healey, William Swain, Henry  
Senior, W. Scott, Thomas Clapham, George  
Hulnes

Mr J. Firth conductor of

of Dewsbury, Mr Paracloagh of Pinstall

Mr. T. Dawson of Bradford and several other professionals were in attendance and expressed their approbation of the splendid manner in which it was performed.

September 10 1843 Castleton in the Peak of Derbyshire. On Sunday the Castleton junior ringers ascended the tower and rang a five peal of 720 Hudson's Light upon Treble Bob System in 3 hours and 57 min. Conducted by Robert How, Cooper. As under are the names of the ringers. 1st Robert How, 2nd John Dobkin. 3rd Robert How, 4th Wm. Eyre, 5th Thomas Ashion, 6th Samuel How, 7th Geo. Hall, Tenor James Hall.

October 29 1843 On Sunday the 23<sup>rd</sup> inst. the celebrated ringers of Saddleworth Yorkshire rang a five peal of treble bob consisting of 720

changes in twenty five minutes on their  
sweet toned bells. In this peal there  
is neither bob nor single. When the  
treble dodges before the third and fourth  
places are made both in the Oscford  
and the Kent treble bob methods. This  
is the first peal ever rung in that method  
on six bells. The ringers were stationed  
as follows First Ralph Broadbent,  
second John Holden, third Benjamin  
Holden, fourth Martin Holden, fifth  
Benjamin Broadbent, Linor Albert Ford.  
The Peal was composed by James Platt  
and conducted by Ralph Broadbent.  
John Holden is in his 79<sup>th</sup> year.

[ James Platt rang the treble to the first  
peal by the St James's Society in 1827 ]

January 28 1844 Shiffnal on  
Tuesday last the Albion Society of  
Shiffnal ascended the ancient tower  
of the parish church and correctly rung  
in excellent style a fine peal of 5040  
Oxford and Kent Treble PB peals in  
3 hours and 8 minutes Conducted  
with much ability by Mr. Thomas Clark  
This clever peal is the production of  
Mr. Thomas Day of Birmingham and  
by the union of the two original methods  
all additional place making is avoided  
This is the first peal on this plan ever  
performed. It was presented to the  
above society by Mr. Lales.



Hardham John. This author, when living was well known among persons of genius and taste. He was born at Chichester and bred a lapidary or diamond cutter; but afterwards became more eminent in another profession, being at the time of his death, possessed of the greatest snuff trade in or about this metropolis. His shop was at the Red Lion, near Fleet-market, in Fleet-street. Besides this he had ~~been~~ for some years been principal numberer to the theatre royal in Drury-Lane. What Mr Hardham's advantages from education were, I never could learn, but, by dint of strong natural parts, and good breeding he rendered himself agreeable to numbers of the most considerable wits and critics of the age and even himself made one attempt in the dramatic way which although it was not even

intended for the stage so in print, and is far from being devoid of genius or poetical imagination. It is entitled *The Fortune Tellers*.

Mr Hardham, however was at once a patron and preceptor to many of our candidates for historic laurels. He was therefore seldom without embryos Richards and Holspers strutting and bellowing in his dining-room or the parlour behind his shop. The latter of these apartments was adorned with heads of most of the persons celebrated for dramatic excellence and to these he frequently referred in the course of his instructions.

There is one circumstance however in his private character which deserves a more honourable rescue from oblivion. His charity was extensive in an uncommon degree and was conveyed to many of its

objects in the most delicate manner. On account of his well known integrity (for he once failed in business more creditably than he could have made a fortune by it) he was often intrusted with the care of paying little annual stipends to unfortunate women, and others who were equally in want of relief; and he has been known with a generosity almost unexampled to continue these annuities long after the sources of them had been stopped by the deaths or caprices of the persons who at first supplied them.

At the same time he persuaded the receivers that their money was remitted to them as usual through its former channel. Indeed his purse was never shut to those who were casually recommended by <sup>his</sup> common acquaintance.

He died in ~~1772~~ September 1772 and by  
his will bequeathed the interest of upwards  
of twenty two thousand pounds in 3 per  
Centis to a female who after the death  
of his wife had gained his strong an  
ascendency over him; and at her decease  
the principal to be the poor of his native  
City. These particulars which reflect  
such honour on Mr. Hardham's memory  
deserve to be as generally known as his  
Popular sort of snuff entitled 37 a  
Combination of figures which in the  
public opinion continues to stand  
at least as high as the political  
number 45.

In Garrick's time John Hardham the well-known tobacconist, opened a shop at No 106, Fleet Street. There at the sign of the "Red Lion" Hardham's Highlander kept steady guard at a doorway through which half the celebrities of the day made their exits and entrances. His celebrated "No 57" snuff was said, like the French mille fleur to be composed of a great number of ingredients and Garrick, in his kind way helped it into fashion by mentioning it favourably on the stage. Hardham a native of Chichester, began life as a servant, wrote a Comedy, acted, and at last became Garrick's "numberer" having a general's quick Coup d'oeil at gauging an audience and so checking the money takers. Garrick once became his security for

a hundred pounds, but eventually Hardham grew rich and died in 1772 bequeathing £22,289 to Chichester, £10 to Parick and merely setting apart £10 for his funeral only vain fools, as he said, spending more. We can fancy the great actors of that day seated on Hardham's tobacco chests, discussing the drollery of Foolie or the vivacity of Elise.

'It has long been a source of inquiry says a writer in the City Press whence the origin of the cognomen No 37 to the celebrated snuff compounded still under the name of John Hardham in Fleet St. There is a tradition that Lord Townsend on being applied to by Hardham, whom he patronised to name the snuff, suggested the Cabalistic number of 37, it being the exact number of a majority obtained in some proceedings in the Irish

Parliament, during the time he was Lord  
Lieutenant there and which was considered  
a triumph for his government. The  
dates however do not serve this theory  
as Lord Townsend was not viceroy till  
the years 1767-72 when the snuff must  
have been well established in public  
fame, and Hardham in the last years  
of his life. It has already been  
printed elsewhere that on the famed  
snuff coming out in the first instance  
David Garrick hearing of it, called in  
Fleet Street as he was wont frequently  
to do, and offered to bring it under  
public notice in the most effectual  
manner, by introducing an incident  
in a new Comedy then about to be  
produced by him, where he would in  
his part in the play, offer another  
character a pinch of snuff who would

eschol its excellence Whereupon Garrick  
agreed to continue the conversation by  
naming the snuff as the renowned 37  
of John Hardham. But the enigma,  
even now, is not solved; so we will  
for what it is worth offer our own  
explanation. It is well known that in  
most of the celebrated snuffs before the  
public a great variety of qualities and  
descriptions of tobacco, and of various  
ages are introduced. Hardham, like  
the rest never told his secret how the  
snuff was made, but left it as a  
heritage to his successors. It is very  
probable, therefore, that the mystic figures  
37 we have quoted represented the  
number of qualities growths and description  
of the 'fragrant weed' introduced by him  
into his snuff and may be regarded as  
a sort of appellative relus or conceit
